

YOUR SUMMER IN CÁDIZ

Cádiz is considered to be one of the oldest continuously inhabited settlements in Europe. Located in Southern Spain, "Gadir" was founded by the Phoenicians around 1100 BC. Cádiz is popularly known as the "tacita de plata" or silver cup, for the shape of its old city center, surrounded by the glimmering waters of the Atlantic Ocean.

Cádiz is an ideal place to submerge yourself in Spanish culture, since it allows for appreciating both the old and the new, from its Roman vestiges to its ties with the Americas. Its distinctive urban planning brings echoes of America's colonial cities, such as San Augustine in Florida, La Habana in Cuba, and Cartagena de Indias in Colombia. You will be able to discover the city's rich history and culture, explore amazing beaches, and experience the daily life of gaditanos. From Cádiz, the program will explore other important cities and sites in Southern Spain, such as Seville and Granada.

This Summer Program consists of a five-week linguistic and cultural immersion experience. The program blends rigorous academic study and varied co-curricular activities. Both, in class and outside of the classroom, students benefit from meaningful real-life communication. Through daily classroom instruction, cultural visits, field trips, and cultural events, such as flamenco dancing and a culinary lesson, students will have the opportunity to develop their language skills. Linguistic immersion at home, in class, and on the streets helps to develop students' linguistic and cultural fluency, as well as confidence.

COURSES

203/204 Intermediate Spanish I and II (6 h)
Students enrolling in SPA 203/204 must have either/or SPA 102/103 or equivalent with C or better.

SPA 204/313 Intermediate Spanish II and Spanish Conversation (6 h). Students enrolling in SPA 204 and SPA 313 must have SPA 203 or equivalent with C or better.

SPA 313/332 Spanish Conversation and Spanish Civilization and Culture (6 h) This conversation course and this culture course are offered only in Spain and provide students with practice and resources available in no other way. Prerequisite: SPA 301 or equivalent with C or better. Students seeking teaching licensure can meet the civilization requirement with SPA 332.

Students choose a six-hour block. Each class meets for an hour and 30 minutes (Monday-Thursday).



The program cost is \$5,400. This price is very reasonable since it includes: cost of instruction (no additional tuition), accommodations, weekly laundry, and three daily meals for five weeks spent in Europe; excursions, visits to museums, and several cultural activities. When in Cádiz, students live and eat their meals in private homes, an arrangement that allows for optimal immersion in Spanish culture. Textbooks, supplies, and air travel between Greensboro and Spain are not included in the program cost. Students will need additional money for personal expenses, local transportation, and independent travel not covered by the program.

REFUND POLICY

Standards of Conduct: Students may be removed from a faculty-led education abroad program for failing to abide by the University's policies or procedures, or other program-specific guidelines or protocols, including, but not limited to, engaging in behavior that may be disruptive or dangerous for other program participants. In these circumstances, the student will be sent home at their own expense and will not receive a refund of fees or expenses.

Program Changes: UNCG reserves the right to cancel or alter the program format or to change costs in case of conditions beyond its control. Short-term faculty-led study abroad programs are subject to modification or cancellation because of natural disasters, political instability, insufficient participation, or other causes. If one of these situations occurs, students may not have any fees or expenses refunded; however, IPC and the sponsoring Department will work in good faith to refund any recoverable costs should the program be canceled. Program fees and charges are based on current airfares, lodging rates, and travel costs, which are subject to change and students are responsible for these differences. If a student willingly leaves a program for any reason, there will be no refund of fees paid or expenses incurred.

Because full refunds are often not possible, students may wish to consider purchasing trip cancellation insurance.

All program directors and participants are REQUIRED to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 prior to departure in order to participate in faculty-led study abroad programs. UNCG reserves the right to cancel or alter the program format or to change costs in case of conditions beyond its control.

HOW TO MAKE PAYMENTS

The program fee will be charged to the student account for the Summer 2023 term. Payment is due according to UNCG Cashier's Office deadlines and procedures.

FINANCIAL AID

Students with leftover financial aid eligibility from fall and spring may be eligible to apply for summer aid to supplement their program. Students should still be prepared to make flight arrangements out-of-pocket, with financial aid to serve as a potential reimbursement.
